Description:

Research Based Policy Grants- G20 is funding scheme research aimed at finding solutions to problems that exist in society, both at the local and global level. Research-based policy grants are a research model which integrates research and community service. This research is oriented science and technology products that have been applied to the relevant field environment or environment. This scheme can be carried out for collaborative research from within or outside the country. Job research cooperation abroad can be done multilaterally or in the form of a consortium.

To strengthen Indonesia's role in the 2022 G20 Presidency forum, Research Based Policy – G20 2022 is oriented towards carrying out research for policy recommendations on strategic issues raised Indonesia in the G20. The topic of the Indonesian Presidency in the 2022 G20 consists of three main pillars are (1) Global Health Architecture, (2) Sustainable Energy Transition, and (3) Digital and Economic Transformation.

Thus, the substance of the policy recommendations generated through this grant scheme must refer to the three main topics above, which are further reduced to themes and issues priority carried by Indonesia in the Working Group (WG) and Engagement Group (EG). The G20 Working Group consists of 12 fields: (1) Agriculture, (2) Anti-Corruption, (3) Development, (4) Digital Economy, (5) Education, (6) Employment, (7) Energy Transition, (8) Environment and Climate Sustainability, (9) Health, (10) Trade, Investment, and Industry, (11) Tourism, dan (12) Women Empowerment and Child Protection. While the Engagement Group (EG) G20 consists of: (1) Parliament (P20), (2) Science (S20), (3) Think (T20), (4) Urban (U20), (5) Women (W20), (6) Business (B20), (7) Civil Society (C20), (8) Youth (Y20), (9) Labor (L20), and (10) Supreme Audit Institutions (SAI20). Policy recommendations that are produced must be contextual with the development of the issue in the G20. Besides that, the resulting policy recommendations are also expected to strengthen institutions G20 and discussed various cross cutting issues across Working and Engagement Groups existing in the 2022 G20 Presidency.
